

The Tikkun Olam Club



for Grades 6-8

Beit Ahavah's Tikkun Olam Club is facilitated by Gili Katz, a native Israeli with extensive youth experience, a love for working with kids, and a deep commitment to **tikkun olam – fixing the world**.

Once a month, Beit Ahavah teens and preteens participate in a direct, hands-on social action project mid-day on selected Sundays. Participants work with Gili to determine what projects they want to add to the already scheduled social action projects. Examples of current and past projects include:

- ❖ Synagogue Recycling Initiative

“**Tikkun Olam**” literally means **fixing** or **repairing the world** – a central element of Reform Judaism and one of the great (and exciting) responsibilities of being a Jew. Students experience doing tikkun olam while having fun. Together they learn about why social justice is such a strong part of Judaism, and find ways to directly repair brokenness in our society and world.
