About our "flour" and our "Torah": In 2017, Beit Ahavah began an innovative leap of faith to change the old-school synagogue dues structure. We created a fair-share dues commitment system, with suggested ranges both to sustain and strengthen our congregation and to make partnership possible for everyone, without having to go through the abatement process. We do this also because we believe that to give is a profoundly spiritual act! We hope everyone will feel this way.

This year Beit Ahavah takes another innovative leap: The old term "Membership" conveyed a club – but we are a community. So we are renaming ourselves as "Partnership" – where everyone belongs.

FAQ ~ Partnership/Dues "Gifts of the Heart" & Payment Information

Why did Beit Ahavah introduce its first major and innovative change to the old-school dues structure, back in 2017? And why do we continue to evolve our dues structure to "Gifts of the Heart"?

With thoughtful research and consideration, Beit Ahavah changed from a Fixed Share system to a Fair Share system. Instead of the synagogue Board determining your contribution ability based on the type of household or income you have (and partners having to request an abatement when needed), the Board established a fair share system which determines what the synagogue needs to exist, with suggested dues, while asking you to determine your capability and means to support the synagogue's ability to exist and grow. If you cannot pay the higher end of the dues, we ask you to determine how much you can pay. You can pay monthly (like with automatic withdrawal for NPR or other charitable organizations), triennially or annually.

It has always been challenging for congregations to determine a dues structure that is fair, affordable and equitable while providing a solid financial base for the synagogue to operate and grow. Expenses for dynamic programming since **COVID-19** are actually greater than before the pandemic. Our evolving dues system and Community Partnership is a statement to welcome everyone while providing complete transparency as to the synagogue's finances and challenges, which encourages partners to invest in a dues commitment that reflects what is needed to sustain and grow Beit Ahavah. The goal is that this system will result in increased financial support and a growth of Partnership, engagement and involvement.

How do I determine my dues commitment / Gift of the Heart?

In Judaism, "dues" are considered both a Gift of the Heart ("Nadiv Lev") from each Partner as well as part of our communal support responsibility ("Tzedakah"). Typically dues increase every year (or in this case, our suggested range), so please review your dues from last year if you are a renewing partner, and consider the importance of an increase - and going beyond the range if you are able to. As expected, Beit Ahavah's basic expenses continue to increase, especially since COVID, and it is our wish to strengthen programming and support rather than have to decrease it! The dues ranges are based on a sense of minimum reasonable amount on the one hand and a figure that will contribute to Beit Ahavah's stability on the other. We will still need to do much additional fundraising beyond dues, as does every organization. So if you are able to give at the top level or beyond the range, please designate that on the partnership form or via the online Partnership form. This will deeply help Beit Ahavah since not everyone is in a position to contribute at higher levels. However, every single dues / Gift of the Heart amount is significant and appreciated!

How much money does Beit Ahavah need to meet our financial goals?

Projected expenses for the coming fiscal year 2023-24 total above \$180,000. Expenses include remuneration for our staff, Rabbi, teachers, specialists, and team; professional services, building space, insurance, technology, internet; programming, community events, supplies; holiday expenses, youth and family programs, life cycles, community outreach.

I might only attend a few events each year/I come all the time. Should this be a factor in my dues?

Think of dues as a way of supporting Beit Ahavah and progressive Judaism in all the value generated for the entire congregation, Jewish community, next generation, world and future! Fair share dues - Gifts of the Heart - support the ongoing operating expenses needed year round associated with making our synagogue's functions and our Rabbi available to all our congregants for joyous events (simchahs) as well as in hard times, and committed to excellence despite being a small congregation. Since COVID-19, we are highly engaged and working in new ways as Rabbi Riqi, Board partners and lay leaders apply all of our creativity to new situations to ensure support for everyone and for our Beit Ahavah Jewish community to thrive.

Will my dues / Gift of the Heart amount be kept confidential?

2023-2024 Scrip Subscription - Donate while you shop!

"Scrip" is like a prepaid credit card used at Stop & Shop or Big Y for food or gas or at River Valley Co-op in Northampton/Easthampton. It never expires!

Beit Ahavah receives a 5% rebate from all Scrip sold! This will add up to a significant amount if many people participate. Scrip is an awesome and easy way for you to provide additional financial support to Beit Ahavah without costing you any more than you already spend on groceries or gas. Scrip cards never expire, can be given as gifts, donated to those in need, or shared with family partners.

Direct Payment saves Beit Ahavah from paying credit card fees.

When you authorize regularly scheduled payments to be made from your Checking or Savings account, your payments will be made automatically on the specified day. Proof of payment will appear with your bank statement.

The authority you give to charge your account will remain in effect until you notify us in writing to terminate the authorization. If the amount of your payment changes, we will notify you at least 10 days before the payment date.
